

Song thrush

Turdus philomelos



What to look for

The same family as the blackbird although slightly smaller

Brown back with pale, speckled under parts

Not to be confused with the larger, more greyish coloured mistle thrush, which has very distinctive white corners to its tail



Where found

Gardens, heaths, woods and fields.

When to look

A resident species, so present all year, but listen for their song, a series of repeated tunes, from February onwards

Not to be confused with...

Mistle thrush

Did you know?

Thrush nests are made from grasses and twigs and are cup-shaped

The nest is lined with mud and rotting wood held together with saliva
